DESCRIPTION OF THE CREST

The College Crest stands for the allround development in Arts, Science & Commerce. The circle of the emblem symbolizes the wholeness of life. The wheel inside represents the Vocational studies & the sweeping progress of Science & Technology. The book speaks of man's constant aspiration to dispel the darkness of ignorance by enlightening the blazing lamp of knowledge & wisdom. It also shows the affiliation of the College to Fakir Mohan University. The boy & the girl holding aloft the torches of flame symbolize the eternal march forward for enlightenment and freedom, which is our motto. "SA VIDYA YA BIMUKTAYE" inscribed in the circle is an extract from the **Rigveda**. The crest of the institution thus beckons the students to various aspects of a glorious and successful life.

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1. A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Rural Institute of Higher Studies, as its name justifies, is a torch-bearer of the rural folk of Bhograi, rendering them the light of knowledge and wisdom. This fertile land is blessed with lots of fertile brain and intellect, but it had no alma mater for higher studies for a long time. With the untiring efforts of certain local visionaries, this college came into being in 1980 and started functioning in the local defunct Elementary Training School with an initial capacity of 128 students in Intermediate of Arts stream. In 1981 the sanctioned strength was extended to 256 in +2 Arts and 128 in + 2 Science stream, and later it was affilated to the Higher Secondary Board in 1983. The +3 Degree Course in Arts was opened in 1986, with an initial capacity of 96 students and this student strength was again increased to 256 in the session 1994-95. The +3 Degree Course in Science and +2 Commerce were opened in 1989 with the seat capacity of 80 (PCM-48 and CBZ-32) and 64 respectively. Later in 2004-05, the Department of Higher Education, Government of Odisha was pleased to increase 64 seats, more in +2 Science and 32 seats more in +2 Commerce streams. The +3 Degree Course in Commerce with a capacity of 64 seats was opened in 2006-07. In the year 2007-08, the number of sanctioned strength in +3 Science increased from 80 to 128. The +2 wings of this college are affiliated to CHSE, Odisha and the +3 wings are affilated to Fakir Mohan University, Balasore, Odisha.

At present, the sanctioned seats in +2 Arts, Science and Commerce streams are 384, 256 and 128 respectively. The sanctioned strength in +3 Arts, Science and Commerce streams are 320, 224 and 128 respectively. The college imparts Honours facilities in English (32 seats), Odia (40 seats), Economics (40 seats), Political Science (40 seats), History (40 seats), Education (40 seats), Philosophy (32 seats) Sanskrit (40 seats) and Mathematics (16 seats) in +3 Arts stream. It provides Honours facility in Physics (48 seats), Chemistry (48 seats), Mathematics (32 seats), Botany (48 seats) and Zoology

(48 seats) in +3 Science stream. In +3 Commerce stream, it also imparts Honourse teaching facility in all 128 seats. At present the total styudent strength in this college is around 3408.

The 2nd January, 1994 is a red-lettered day in the annals of this college. The college that had started functioning in a long abandoned and dilapidated building of an Elementary Training School since 1980 shifted to a sprawling mansion by the untiring effort of the then Principal Prof. H. K. Das, and since then the institution has never looked back. The college now possesses a spacious campus with several departmental Honours Rooms, Seminar Rooms, General Class Halls, Computer Lab, Language Hub (Skill Junction), well-equipped separate laboratories for both +2 and +3 streams, separate Libraries for both +2 and +3 wings, Botanical Gardens and floricultures and Administrative Block. Within the most attractive items of the college are the well decorated Audotorium, newly constructed P.G. Department of Language and Literature, and the Central Library in progress. A lot of new feathers are going to be added to its glory very shortly by the esteemed principal Prof. K.S. Das.

Rural Institute of Higher Studies is one of the few reputed full-fledged composite colleges in Odisha imparting education from +2 level to Post-graduate level. Though a college in a rural area, this institute of higher studies aims at moulding the allround development of students' personality by imparting social and environmental awareness to them. With these objectives in mind, the National Service Scheme (NSS) was introduced in 1983. The social concern of the students got a wider canvas when Youth Red Cross (YRC) was set up in 1996. The social awareness among the students got rapid momentus when Rovering and Rangering Activities (Scout and Guide) for both boys and girls were opened in the college in 2016-17 and National Cadet Crops (NCC) laid its foundation in 2017. To enhance the computer literacy among the students, Joint Venture Computer Programmne was started in 2001. In order to impart a sound language base, Language Hub (Skill Junction) was established in 2015-16. The college justified its name when the Post-Graduate classes in English and Odia (self-financing) started in 2018-19, thanks to the then principal Prof. G. Das Mohapatra and the then Hon'ble Minister of Education, Govt. of Odisha, Mr. Ananta Das for their efford and dedication. The sanctioned strength of MA in English is 16 and in Odia it is also 16.

The college is well-known for its good and conducive academic atmosphere. The continuous dedication of the staff and the promising zeal of the esteemed principals have contributed a lot to maintain an excellent academic track record for years and have resulted in producing several toppers both in the CHSE and the University level. The institute has already passed its four glorious decades, leaving a spectacular imprint in the field of wisdom and learning. The college was accredited by NAAC in 2016 and was awarded 'B' Grade. The academic spell of this RIHS has been so great, since its inception, that hardly has there been a single village in Bhograi at present where a graduate of this college is not found.

2. Re-admission:

13. RULES OF COLLEGE

1. The academic session of the college is from 1st June to 31st May.

2. Commencement of Classes:

The date of commencement of the classes will be notified by the Principal when the college reopens after Summer vacation.

3. Admission:

- a) Students seeking admission to the college in +2 Arts/Science / Commerce and +3, Arts / Science / Commerce streams should follow the guidelines provided by SAMS.
- b) Selected candidates have to take admission on dates assigned to them in the intimation card.
- c) Any change in subjects may be allowed within 21 days after the class begins.
- d) Admission to Honours courses shall be made soon after the class begins.

4. Address:

Each student must register in the college office his/her permanent & present address. Any change in the address must be intimated to the college office immediately.

5. Identity Card:

Students are advised to keep with them their identity cards always in order to avail all the privileges to them as under rules.

6. Dress Code:

Students admitted must here to the college dress code.

7. Student Problem:

Students are allowed to meet the Pricipal directly in connection with their problems. They should consult the H.O.D. of the subject concerned relating to academic affairs.

8. Fees:

Fees must be paid in the college office on the dates fixed for collection, otherwise a fine of 50 paise will be realised from them from the next date of collection.

9. Discipline:

- a) Students should take their seats before the teacher enters the class room and should not ordinarily leave their seats during the lectures. Late comers should not claim their attendance even if allowed to attend classes.
- b) Students must not spit on walls, floors, pillars, doors and windows of the college. They should not stick any bill on the walls, nor do they write anything on the walls, doors, black board or green board etc.
- c) A student of the college must bide by the hygenic principles and submit himself/herself to such antiepidemic procedure as would be laid down by the Principal.
- d) No student should ordinarily stroll or gossip with others on the corridors or veranda. The students should remain in the Students Common Room specified for them if they have no class by that time.
- e) At all places inside the college premises including the play ground and even in meetings, proper decorum must be maintained by the students. As the college is an educational institution, students politics in the college should be dealt in a scholarly way, in the form of lectures & discussion through a democratic process.
- f) Students coming with bicycles are advised to keep their bicycles in the Cycle Stand provided to them and lock them up for safety. Bicycles should never be kept on the corridors.

g) Disciplinary action may be taken against the students violating the above rules by the Principal as he is the final authority in all matters. A student who is rusticated or expelled shall leave the college and vacate hostel, if he/ she is a boarder, irrespective of his/her payment of the college or Hostel fees in advance. Such fees, if paid in advance, shall be forfeited.

10. Issue of C.L.C., Conduct Certificate etc.:

A student should submit application in prescribed proforma for College Leaving Certificates, Continuing Certificates, Apearing Certificates and Conduct Certificates after clearing all dues atleast three days before the date of issue of the concerned Certificate.

Duplicate C.L.C. can be issued on production of an affidavit before the Executive Magistrate and Police station diary report and news paper cutting, in case of loss, on payment of Rs. 200/- along with an application in the prescribed proforma. The certificate will be issued within seven days from the date of application.

Conduct Certificate will ordinarily be issued at the time of taking C.L.C. by the students.

11. All applications from the students to the Principal must come through the Head Clerk of the college. No application shall be entertained directly to the Principal without the knowledge of the Head Clerk.

12. Time Table:

Students are advised to attend their respective classes according to the time table published in the Notice Board of the college. Any change in the time table will be notified to the students.

13. Interview hours (for the students) to meet the Principal is between 12 noon to 1 p.m. on all working days.

Students can meet the Principal with due permission.

14. EXAMINATIONS COLLEGE, COUNCIL & UNIVERSITY.

College Examination:

- 1. There shall be Half-yearly Examination and Annual Examination for the +2, First year students and Test Examination for the +2, 2nd yr, +3, 1st yr, +3, IInd Yr. and +3, IIIrd year students.
- 2. The students absenting themselves from college examination without the prior-permission of the Principal will be fined for each paper.
- The students resorting to malpractice and misbehaviour will be seriously dealt with & will run the risk of being expelled from the college on the ground of misconduct.
- 4. No student shall be allowed to the examination hall without the Identity Card.
- In case a student fails to secure the qualifying marks for promotion he / she will however be considered for promotion by the staff council in accordance with certain guiding principles.
- 6. A student is required to attend at least 75 percent of the General lectures, 75 percent of the Tutorial and Practical Classes. Attendance will be counted separately under each head. Condonation of attendance between 60 and 75 percent may be granted in exceptional cases.

Council Examination:

 The Higher Secondary Examination in Arts, Science and Commerce stream shall ordinarily be held twice a year. The Annual Examination shall be held in the month of March and the Instant Examination shall be held in the month of August every year.

- In order to be sent up for the Higher Secondary Annual Examination every student must :
- a) Prove himself/ herself to be good in conduct.
- b) Prove himself/ herself to have studied diligently.
- c) Pass the Test Examination conducted by the college.
- d) A candidate is required to attend 75 percent of the lectures and Tutorials or Practical classes taken separately in each subject during the year and condonation may be granted only to the extent of 15 percent in exceptional cases.
- 3. Qualification for admission to the Second Examination:
- a) All failed candidates having aggregate of 315 marks but failed in one subject are eligible for instant Examination.
- b) Candidates who were selected for the Annual Examination but were unable to appear.
- c) Candidates who failed in the Test Examination provided they take another Test and pass it.
- d) All private candidates who were registered for the Annual Examination but could not appear.
- e) Candidates who were not sent up for the Annual Examination due to shortage in attendance, provided that they put in attendance for at least a term to make up the shortage and have passed the Examination.
- 4. Each Examination for a theory paper carrying 100 or 70 marks shall be of 3 hours duration and the practical examination shall be of 3 hours duration also.
- The distribution of marks and papers can be obtained from the courses of studies prepared by the Council of Higher Secondary Education. Students can get all inform at i on about this from the Library.

University Examination (Three year Degree Course)

1.1 The Three Year Degree Course leading to the Bachelor's Degree in Arts / Science / Commerce of Fakir Mohan

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- University shall be spread over a period of three academic years and six semesters.
- 1.2 A candidate for the Bachelor's Degree in Arts, Science and Commerce Examinations shall be required to en-roll himself/herself under these regulation as a student in any one of the colleges affiliated to this University.

Admission to the Course:

- 2.1 Any student, who has passed the Higher Secondary Examination of the Council of Higher Secondary Education, Odiha or any other Qualifying Examination recognized by the Academic Council of CHSE, Odisha as equivalent thereto, may be admitted to the 1st year of this course provided that a student shall not be admitted into Degree Course in Science unless he/she has passed the qualifying examination in science.
- 2.2 No student shall ordinarily be admitted to the 1st year of the course of a college four weeks (including holidays and Sundays) after the date of publication of results of the Annual Higher Secondary Examination of the Council of Higher Secondary Education, Odisha after the re-opening of the Summer Vacation which ever is later. In exceptional cases, the appropriate authority may notify the last date of admission.
- 2.3 Candidates who, for some valid reasons are unable to take admission within the time prescribed under regulation 2.2 above, may however be admitted to the college within two weeks (including holidays and sundays) from the last date of admission with a late fee as prescribed by the University. The Principal of the college shall intimate the names of such candidates and their dates of admission and shall remit the late fee collected to the University in one lot within two weeks from the date of such late admission.
- 2.4 Candidates who have taken admission, on payment of the late fee, shall have the percentage of lectures counted from the date of such admission.

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- 2.5 Candidate passing the Instant Higher Secondary Examination of the Council of Higher Secondary Education, Odisha may be admitted to a college within two weeks (including Holidays and Sundays) after the publication of their results provided that the candidates may be admited within one week thereafter with a late fee as prescribed by the University for each candidate. A candidate so admitted shall have the percentage of lectures counted from the date of his/ her admission.
- 2.6 Admission to the second and third year course shall be completed within two weeks of the reopening of the college without waiting for the publication of results of the first and second University examinations provided that the students may be admitted to the second or third year, as the case may be, within a further period of two weeks, (including Sunday & Holidays), on payment of a late fee as prescribed by the University for each student.
- 2.7 Further, students who could not appear the University Examination due to shortage of attendance shall be allowed to take admission in the same year at the begining of the immediate subsequent academic session subject to the availability of the seats. Preference shall be given to the students who have secured higher marks in the last CHSE or University Examination as the case may be.
- 2.8 Not withstanding anything contained in the preceding regulations, where the syndicate of the University permits increase of seats in any class or gives fresh affiliation to any new subject in any college, the date of issue of such order shall be deemed as the date of publication of results of the council of Higher Secondary Education, Odisha for the purpose of admission thereto.
- 2.9 A candidate whose results of Higher Secondary Examination are published late by the Examining Authority, may be admitted to the college within two weeks of the publica-

tion of his/her results depend on the availability of seats provided that no student can be admitted into +3, 1st year class beyond 31st December of the concerned academic year.

Change of subject (s):

3. A candidate admitted to the college with particular subjects or combination of subjects in to the first year may be allowed to change the subjects or combination of subjects by the Principal till thirty days after the last date of admission to first year course as prescribed in the provision of the clause-2 of regulation.

Qualification for Admission to the first, second and final examination

- 4.1 Any registered student of the University may be admitted to the First Examination if he/she has completed in one or more colleges admitted for the purpose of such examination in the subjects in which he/she offers a regular course of study for not less than one academic year after passing the Higher Secondary Examination conducted by the Council of Higher Secondary Education, Odisha or any other examination recognized by CHSE, Odisha and Fakir Mohan University as equivalent thereto, provide he/she is not otherwise ineligible to appear the said examination.
- 4.2 Any registered student of the University may be admitted to the Second Examination for the Bachelor's Degree in Arts / Science/ Commerce if he/she has cleared the first examination in the concerned stream or has appeared the said examination and has thereafter completed a regular course of study for not less than one academic year in the second year course in one or more colleges admitted for the purpose of such examination in the subjects which he / she offers, provided that he / she is not otherwise ineligible for appearing the said examination.
- 4.3 Any registered student of the University may be admitted to the Final Examination for the Bachelor's Degree in Arts/

Science / Commerce if he/ she has cleared the second examination in the concerned stream or has appeared the said examination and has thereafter completed a regular course of study for not less than one academic year in the third year course in one or more colleges admitted for the purpose of such examination in the subjects which he / she offers, provided that he/she is not otherwise ineligible for appearing the said examination.

4.4 In order to clear an examination (First/Second/Final) a candidate is required to secure 30% marks in each theory paper and 40% in each practical paper.

Attendance:

- 14. A candidate shall be required to attend 75% of the lectures, tutorials and practical classes, taken separately, in each subject during each academic year and condonation in exceptional case may be granted by the college to the extent of 15%.
- 15. The Syndicate may grant further condonation of shortage in attendance to the extent of 10% in respect of candidates who represented the University or State on deputation for any Inter-University or National Camp competition games or sports to be recorded in writing.
- 16. A candidate may be permitted to take up one of the M.I.L. as specified under clauses 14.3 of these regulation without the requirement of attendance at lectures, if a college in which he or she is admitted is not affiliated in that subject.

Application for Admission to Examination:

- 17.1 Candidate seeking admission to the First/Second/Final examination in Arts, Science or Commerce should specify the subjects/papers as the case may be in which he desires to be examined for the Pass and Honours examination in the form of application prescribed for the purpose.
- 17.2 The application submitted by every candidate for admission to any examination, other than the back subject(s)

papers in Arts/Science/Commerce shall contain a certificate of the candisate(s) (i) good conduct, (ii) diligent study, (iii) having maintained the required percentage of attendance in each class or having obtained condonation for the shortage or attendance in it, is within the admissible range & (iv) having satisfactorily passed the periodical and test examination conducted by the college concerned, duly signed by the Principal or by any teacher or the college authorized for the purpose by the Principal of the College. Failure to earn any of the aforesaid certificates from the Principal of the college will disqualify the candidate for being admitted to the examination till earns the same. Provided that, a candidate seeking admission to an examination under Regulation 5.3 (clearance of back subject papers) need not obtain attendance certificates. He/She should however, obtain other certificate as required.

- 17.3 The fees payable for registration/admission to any examination, under this regulation shall be as prescribed from time to time.
- 17.4 If a candidate has paid full fees for all the subjects, in any examination, but remained absent in all the subjects, he/ she shall be required to pay full prescribed fees if he appears at the same examination again in the subsequent years.

Dropping of Honours Course:

18. A candidate taking Honours Course initially in a subject may choose to drop the Honours course in writing and adopt the pass course in the same subject at the time of submitting his application for the First Examination or earlier and he/she then appears subsequent examination.

Migration:

19. Any candidate who has been registered as such in any other University of the State will be permitted to migrate to the University to register either for the First, Second or the Final Examination of this University. In such case, the marks obtained by his/her in the First or Second Examination as the case may be of the other University will be taken as the marks obtained by him/her for the result as per the provision of the regulation Act and Statute.

Duration of Period and Groups:

- 20.1 For B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Pass & Honours), each period shall be of maximum of 50 minutes duration. Each practical class may cover a minimum of 3 periods. Each tutorial/practical group will consist of a maximum of a 16 students. A general group class will have a maximum of 128 students.
- 20.2 The subjects having full mark 50 (MIL and English for Science students) shall have at least 2 lecture periods per week. All subjects/papers without practical component in Arts/ Sc./Com. (Pass/Compulsory/Elective/Minor Elective/Major Elective) having 100 full marks shall atleast 3 lecture periods per week per paper except Mathematics Pass for which 4 lecture periods per week per paper and subjects (Arts/Sc.) pass with practical component shall have 4 lecture periods per week/per paper. All Honours papers (Arts/Sc.) having practical component having full mark of 100 (75 in Theory & 25 in Practical) shall have at least 4 lecture periods and 1 practical class of 3 lecture periods duration per week (Except Mathematics).

Conduct of Examination:

25.1 The duration of theory and practical examinations shall be as follows :

Theory - 80/100 marks......3 hours

Practical - 50 marks or above...... 6 hours

25.2 The question paper in the University Examination shall contain alternative questions from each unit of the course of studies prescribed by the University.

Publication of Results:

- 26.1 The results of the three years B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Degree Examination and the classes to be awarded shall be determined on the basis of the combined result of the First, Second and Final Examination taken together.
- 26.2 a. As soon as possible preferably within 45 days after the completion of the Final Examination (Theory paper) the syndicate shall publish a list of successful candidates based on the marks of First, Second and Final Examination.
 - b. There shall be separate list for candidates of Pass and Honours in each stream of Arts, Science, Commerce.
 - c. The list of candidates passed in the First Class in the Honours Courses of a particular subject shall be arranged in order of merit and the list of all other successful candidates of the Honours courses of that subject shall be arranged alphabetically and college wise. In case of a successful Honours candidate obtaining distinction it shall be mentioned against his/her name in the list.
 - d. Candidate who pass in their first appearances and in one session will be placed above those who pass with back paper clearance in the merit list.
 - e. The list of candidates who pass the pass courses shall be arranged college wise according to the roll numbers. In case a candidate has obtained Distinction it shall be mentioned against his/her name.
- 26.3 Each successful candidate at the Final Examination of the 3 years Degree Course shall receive a diploma in prescribed form signed by the Vice-Chancellor.

15. RULES OF HOSTELS

 The college has three Ladies' Hostels, having 30 seats in Ladies' Hostel-1, 38 in Ladies' Hostel-2 and 40 in Ladies' Hostel-3 which run under the supervision of the Superintendents, who are deputed by the Principal from the teaching staff.

- 2. The selection for the hostels is made completely on the merit basis.
- 3. The session of the hostels is from June to May.
- A student getting admitted to the College Hostel in any term will have to pay the monthly charge up to the end of the term.
- 5. A student who has admitted to the Hostel but not stayed, then she will not have to pay monthly charge but her admission charge will be forfited.
- A boarder admitted to the hostel must abide by the rules of the hostel, otherwise she will be expelled from the hostel by the Superintendent / Principal.
- 7. The allotment of seats in the hostel is the discretionary power of the Superintendent.
- 8. A boarder seeking leave from the hostel must apply to the Supt. in advance and obtain his/her permission for it.
- 9. The presence of the boarders will be checked at 6 pm. everyday.
- 10. If a boarder decides to leave the hostel for ever she will have to apply to the Supdt. and to clearup the seat rent for the continuing term.
- 11. Every Boarder is responsible for the hostel furniture alloted to her. In case of any breakage the cost will be deducted from the caution money of the concerned boarder.
- 12. The hostel, as well as the mess, will be closed during Durga Puja Vacation and Summer Vacation.
- 13. The study hour in the hostel is from 6.30 am. to 9 am. (morning) and 6.30 pm. to 9.30 pm.(evening). It should be strictly maintained by the boarders.
- 14. Boarders sent up for Council & University Examination have to pay hostel dues in full, upto the end of the session, before they fill up their forms failing which they will not be allowed to fill up forms.

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- 15. Monthly mess charges may be varied during the session depending on the price index of the time.
- 16. No meeting can be held by the boarders during study hours without the permission of the Superintendent.
- 17. Guest meals shall not be entertained in the mess without the prior permission of the Superintendent.
- 18. One Prefect and an Asst. Prefect shall be appointed by the Superintendent, from the boarders, in order to assist the Superintendent in maintaining discipline in the Hostel.
- 19. All complaints against the cook and the attendants should be brought to the notice of the Superintendent.
- 20. A boarder may be rusticated from the Hostel on the report of the Superintendent for gross misconduct.
- 21. Inmates of Ladies hostel shall not be allowed to go outside the hostel campus during early morning or beyond working hours of the college for private coaching, computer education, etc.
- 22. A boarder seeking leave from the hostel must apply to the Superintendent in advance and the Superintendent must duly be intimated by the guardian in time for the purpose.
- 23. Boarders are asked to submit one photograph and the contact number of her legal/local guardian for recognisation.
- 24. No guardian (legal / local) will be allowed to meet the boarders beyond the visiting hours.

Visiting hours: Morning 8 am to 9 am

Afternoon 4 pm to 5 pm

Arrangement of Mess in the Hostel:

- 1. The Hostel Mess is controlled by the Hostel Superintendent.
- 2. One Mess Manager and an Asst. Manager will be nominated from the boarders by the Superintendent for every

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month. He / She is to run the mess for the particular month for which he/she has been nominated.

- 3. The mess provides only two meals a day. Boarders should take their meals in a disciplined way in the dining space.
- 4. Each boarder has to pay Rs. 200/- only in advance at the time of admission towards mess and Rs. 100/- on the 15th day of each month for the same.
- 5. Guest meals can be entertained by a boarder for a maximum of 3 days in a month.
- 6. Mess establishment charge is same for all boarders and it has no link with the number of meals taken.
- 7. Neither a guest meal nor stopping of a meal shall be entertained by a boarder after 4 pm. of the day.
- 8. The boarders default in mess dues can not enjoy guest meal in her name or in the name of other boarders.
- Serious action will be taken by the Superintendent for misappropriation of mess money either by the manager or by any boarder.
- 10. Boarder should take their meal at the fixed meal hours as follows:

9.30 A.M. to 12.00 A.M. (Morning) 9.30 P.M. to 10.30 P.M. (Evening)

16. THE LIBRARY & ITS RULES

The College Library opens on all working days. The books in the library are arranged in different sections and subsections. The members of the staff and the bonafied students of the this college are permitted to borrow books from the library.

There are mainly two sections in the Library such as-

- 1. General Library
- 2. Lending Library

All the sections of the Library are under the administrative control of the Principal. The Professor-

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in-charge of the Library, nominated by the principal for a session, exercises an effective control in all matters related to the Library with the aid and advice of the principal.

The following library rules are framed for the guidance of all.

Rules of the General Library.

For Staff:

- 1. A member of the teaching staff can borrow a maximum number of 15 book.
- 2. Maximum number of books which can be borrowed by a member of the non-teaching staff is as follows:
 - a) Demonstrator 3
 - b) Class III Employee 3
 - c) Class IV Employee 1
- 3. A teacher is ordinarily allowed to borrow books on any literature and the subject in which he/she is a teacher.
- 4. In case of borrowing books from other subjects a teacher has to take written permission from the Principal.
- 5. The teacher is allowed to keep the books for a maximum period of one academic session.
- 6. The books borrowed from the library should be returned before the Summer Vacation.
- 7. Any property of the Library lost or damaged by a member of the staff is to be recovered from him/her after proper investigation.
- 8. The members of non-teaching staff are allowed to keep the books for a maximum period of 30 days.

For Students:

 A student can borrow a maximum number of 3 books from the library in every 15 days but this restriction is not applicable to the students who have secured more than 80% of marks.

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- 2. The maximum number of days for which students may keep the books is 15.
- 3. A fine of 25 paise per book will be imposed on the borrower for each day of default in returning a book.
- 4. A student against whom any fine is outstanding will not be allowed to borrow books from the library until the books are returned or the fine is paid or the case may be.
- 5. The Principal may impose fine to a student or a group of students for the improper use of the book or the journal.
- 6. Library cards will be issued to each student after the production of library card and books will be issued. In case of loss of such card a duplicate card will be issued to him/her on payment of Rs. 10/- and only after taking the prior permission of the principal.

FOR STAFF AND STUDENTS

- 1. No books shall be taken out of the Library without the knowledge of the Librarian or until it is properly issued.
- 2. The borrower must examine the condition of the book before it is issued to him/her. Otherwise if any mutilation is discovered later, the action and fine will be imposed against the borrower.
- 3. If the due date of the return of the books falls on an authorised holiday, it may be returned on the next working day.
- Certain books may be reserved by the Principal for exclusive use in the Library on the recommendation of the Heads of the Department concerned.
- 5. Nobody can borrow books for others.
- 6. Any book lost, damaged or defected by a borrower must be replaced by him. If a book is one volume of a series, the whole series must be replaced by the borrower.
- 7. Those who use the library are supposed to have read the library rules and abide by them. Ignorance of the rules will not be considered as an excuse for violating the same.

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- 8. If the book is not available in the market, the borrower must have to pay ten times cost of the catalogue price of the book. In case the price is not clearly evident, the borrower has to pay the amount fined by the Principal.
- All sections of the library run under the over all administrative control of the Principal.

RULES FOR LENDING LIBRARY

- 1. This is a section of the library, which contains Test Books to be leased out to the poor and deserving students.
- 2. Not more than two books can be issued to a particular student.
- 3. One tenth price of each book will be paid by the students at the time of the issue of books. This amoun is not refundable.
- 4. Books issued must be returned before the College Annual or University examination. Students desirous to keep books till the completion of the examinations must take the writen permission from the Principal.
- 5. Towards the end of the session the librarian will report the Principal the name of the defaulters and the Principal will take the action as deems fit.

Rules for receiving and returning Library Books for students:

Students will receive and return their library books in the college library twice a month. The transaction hours of students in the Library is from 11 A.M. to 2 P.M. They will submit the requisition slip for borrowing library books one day before their scheduled date of issue, during the time period from 11 A.M. to 2 P.M. on all working days. If the date of issue of books is a Sunday the books shall be issued on Monday at 2 P.M. to 3.30 P.M. But students must submit their requisition slip on Saturday. The requisition slips are available at the circulation centre. Students will stick to their specific dates mentioned below. They should maintain discipline at the circulation centre and submit their library cards at the time of issue of books.

17. COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The College Magazine "THE SWARNARENU" is published once a year. The magazine provides ample opportunity for students and teachers of this college to reflect their literary worth/talent as well as to develop their creative attitudes.

The Editorial Board consisting of a few members of the teaching staff is nominated by the Principal. Two other student representatives are elected by the students as Secretary and Asst. Secretary in order to assist the Editorial Board in publishing the College Magazine.

18. THE COLLEGE CALENDAR

The College Calendar is published once a year, i.e. in the first quarter of every academic session. It portrays a view

of the college containing rules, regulations and infrastructures. It is edited by the members of the teaching staff as nominated by the Principal.

19. THE COLLEGE UNION

(Degree Wing)

The name of the College Union is R.I.H.S. College Union. The Union shall remain as the sole tribunal of the students opinion inside the college.

1. Objectives:

- a) To organise discussion on general, cultural, academic, national and international issues.
- b) To invite eminent persons to address at functions of the union.
- c) To represent to the authority the views of its members in all matters relating to them.

2. Membership:

Every student whose name is on the rolls of the college is a member of the Union.

3. Executive Committee

There shall be an Executive Committee of the College Union consisting of the following office bearers.

- i) Principal (Ex-officio)
- ii) Advisor and Asso. Advisor College Union.
- iii) President
- iv) Vice-President
- v) General Secretary
- vi) Asst. General Secretary
- vii) All class Representatives of Degree Streams.
- viii) Women's Representative.

4. Functions of the Executive Committee.

i) It shall prepare the budget of the Union for the session and get it approved by the Principal.

- ii) To draw up programme of the Union for the session.
 - To convene and hold meetings of the Union:
- i) An ordinary meeting of the Executive Committee may be called by the secretary in consulation with the President and the Advisor.
- ii) Notice of the ordinary meeting with date, time, place and agenda shall be given to members at least 48 hours prior to the meeting.
- iii) An urgent meeting of the committee can be convened at any time either by the President of the College Union or by the Principal.
- iv) Meeting of the Executive shall be presided over by the President or in his absence by the Vice-President.
- v) 50% of the members of the Executive Committee shall constitute the quorum.
- vi) The minutes of the Executive Committee shall be maintained by the secretary and a copy of it shall be communicated to the Principal through the Advisor within 24 hours of every meeting.
- vii) No meetings of Executive Committee will be valid unless Advisor is present at such meetings and puts his / her signature of the proceedings of the meetings.

5. Advisor:

- i. There shall be an Advisor of the Union appointed by the Principal from among the members of the teaching staff. The Principal may appoint one or more Associate Advisors to asist the Advisor in discharging the activities of the Union.
- ii. The Advisor will remain present at all the meetings of the Union. He will assist the Union by helpful suggestion, if necessary, in proper conduct of the meeting.
- iii. The President may refer to him any rule for interpretation & in such cases the decision of the Advisor shall be final.
- iv. The Advisor may at any time during a meeting or at the

request of the President explain the scope and effect of a motion or amendment.

- v. The Advisor will not preside over the meeting unless the President requests him to do so in writing.
- vi. Associate Advisors shall remain present in all meetings and assist the Advisor at the time of need.

6. President:

Any regular student of the Degree stream is eligible to stand for election to the Presidentship of the Union. The President shall preside over all the ordinary meetings of the Union at which he is present. He shall be responsible for maintenance of order and interpretation of rules.

7. Vice-President:

Any regular student of the Degree stream is eligible to stand for election of the Vice Presidentship of the Union. In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall preside over the ordinary meeting of the Union and shall assume all his powers & duties as that of the President.

8. **Secretary:**

Any regular student of the Degree Stream may contest for the office of the Secretary, College Union.

The Secretary shall give notices for holding meeting of the Union and record their minutes.

He shall select subjects for debate in consultation with the President and Advisor.

He shall keep the accounts of the Union.

He shall produce all vouchers to the Advisor for his/her approval.

9. Assistant Secretary:

Any regular student of the Degree Stream may contest for the office of the Assistant Secretary, College Union.

The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary

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to discharge his/her duties. During the absence of the Secretary he/she shall perform all his/her function.

10. Ordinary meeting of the Union:

- a) All ordinary meetings shall be presided over by the President.
- b) At least 2 days before a notice shall be given for every ordinary meeting.
- c) Ordinary meetings shall be convinced once a fortnight if necessary.

11. Procedure of the meeting:

- a) In the absence of the President and Vice-President for any ordinary meeting, the members present will elect a chairman for among themselves. The Advisor will take the chair till the election is over. The chairman will assume all the rights and discharge all the duties of the President during a meeting.
- At the beginning of each ordinary meeting, the Secretany shall read out the minutes being approved by the President.
- c) Amendment to any minutes/motion (if any) shall be submitted in writing to the Secretary at the beginning of the meeting. No amendment will be made that negates the original motion.
- d) Every speech shall be relevant to the subject of a debate or the amendment proposed. No personal reflection shall be made in course of the meeting.
- e) Points Order: The Advisor/Associate Advisors or any member of Executive Committee may call the President's attention to a point of order even while a member is speaking. But no speech shall be made on such point of order.

12. Votes on Debate:

a) At the conclusion of the debate the mover of the original motion has to exercise his right of reply. The amendment is put to vote for finalization.

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- All questions in the debate shall be determined by a majority of vote of members present.
- c) If the votes are equally divided, the President shall cast his vote.

13. Extra-ordinary meeting of the Union may be convened:

- i) At the instruction of the Principal,
- ii) At the request of the President, College Union,
- iii) On a written requisition address to the Principal and signed by not less than 1/3 members of the Union,
- iv) The Principal shall preside over any extra-ordinary meeting of the Union,

14. Discipline:

The President may call any member to order. If a member disobeys or disregards any order ruling of the President or Advisor or Associate Advisor, the President may ask the member to withdraw from the meeting and may report his/her name to the Principal. If necessary the President can dissolve the meeting.

In any case not provided for in these rules, the Advisor / Associate Advisor shall give a ruling as to the procedure on the principles already laid down and his ruling shall be final.

15. Supervision of the Executive Committee:

If the principal is satisfied, the Executive Committee has been acting or likely to act in a manner prejudicial to the interest of the college or students or that if it has failed to discharge its function & duties properly he may by order supercede the said Executive Committee and make arrangement to carry out the activities of the Union in a manner decided by him.

16. Members of Teaching Staff:

All meetings of the Union shall be opened to all members of the Teaching staff. If they so desire, can take part in the proceeding. They are not entitled to vote.

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17. College Union Fund:

- All expenditures of the Union shall be met out of a fund raised through subscription from Degree students of the college.
- b) The Executive Committee in consulation with the Advisor /Associate Advisor shall prepare the Annual budget of the Union & submit the same to the Principal for his approval.
- c) The Advisor shall maintain the accounts and he is to recieve all money from the Principal in connection with the Union.
- d) All members of the College Union shall pay a consolidated fee of Rs. 35/- per annum to be collected by the college office at the time of admission to each academic session.

18. College Election:

a) Election shall be held for the different posts of 'office bearers' and 'Executive members' of the College Union as per the notification issued by the Govt. of Odisha.

(vi) Asst. Scey. O.S.S. (xiii)Secy., Magazine Society

(vii) Secy. S.S.G. (xiv)Asst.Secy.,Magazine

Post of Executive Member:

- (i) All Class Representatives
- (ii) Secy. D.S.A.

(iii) Asst. Secy. D.S.A. (vii) Asst. Secy. G.C.R.

(iv) Secy. Science Society (viii) Secy. B.C.R.

(v) Asst. Secy. Science Society (ix) Asst. Secy. B.C.R.

(vi) Secy. G.C.R. Representative(x) Women's

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19. Eligibility Criteria for Candidates:

- (i) Under graduate students between the ages of 17 and 22 years may contest election.
- (ii) The candidate should in no event have any academic arrears (i.e. back paper) in the year of contesting the election.
- (iii) The candidate should have attended the minimum percentage of attendance as prescribed by the University or 75% attendance which is higher.
- (iv) A regular candidate in his/her three year studentship shall have one chance to contest for the post of office bearer and two chances to contest for the post of an 'executive members'.
- (v) The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record, that is to say he/she should not have been tried and/or convicted of any criminal offence or misbehaviour. The candidate shall also not have been subject to any disciplinary action by the University authorities.
- (vi) The candidate must be a regular, fultime student of the college and should not be a distance / proximate education student.

20. Nominations

- a) The scrutiny of nominations, declaration of valid nominations and the date of withdrawal of the nominations shall be notified by the Principal.
- b) A member can seek election to one office only.
- c) The nomination is done after proper scrutiny by the Principal or by nominee(s) or by a committee constituted by him for the purpose. The valid list of candidates contesting for various posts shall be notified on the day of nomination.
- d) The withdrawal (if any) of nomination papers can be made in writing to the Principal within a specified time as fixed by the Govt.

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- e) Election shall be conducted and vote recorded and attested in such a manner as determined by the Principal.
- f) No member shall give more than one vote for each office.
- g) In case of a tie between two or more candidates the election shall be determined by toss.
- h) Members of the Union shall be asked to produce their Identity Card at the time of casting their votes.
- i) Members of the Union shall clear their college dues, either by getting themselves admitted or readmitted.
- j) In no case a recounting of votes is permissible and the candidates have to assertain about their position in the election from their respective agents.
- k) The Principal shall be the final authority in all matters concerning the procedure of election and conduct of election and his decisions shall be final.

Vacancies and Tenure of Office of the Executive Committee of the College Union :

- a) The office bearers shall hold office for the entire academic session unless-
- i) They cease to be the students of the college
- ii) They voluntarily resign in writing addressed to the Principal and the same is accepted by the Principal,
- iii) They are removed by a motion passed by a three fourth majority of the members of the union present and voting expressing lack of confidence in them at an extraordinary meeting called for the purpose.
- b) Office bearers who appear at a University Examination shall be deemed to have vacated their office on the date University Application forms are filled up by him/her.
- c) After the election is over and results are published the Principal shall call a general meeting of the Union, where the newly elected office bearers shall take Oath and assume charge. All the members of the staff & students shall be invited to attend the Oath taking Ceremony.

21. Amedment of the provision of the Bye-law:

Any amendment of the Bye-law is to be made by the Staff Council.

22. Interpreation of the Bye-law:

The Principal shall be the final authority on all matters relating to the Union and may at his discretion alter, avoid, supplement amend or abrogate any of those rules.

20. YOUTH WELFARE ACTIVITIES (A) THE NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian-sponsored public service programme by the Department of Youth Affairs and Sports of Government of India which was launched in Gandhiji's Centenary year in 1969. Aimed at developing students overall personality through community service, NSS is a voluntary association of young people in +2 level, colleges and universities that works for a campus-community linkage. Its cardinal principle is to organise programme by the students themselves, both by the students and teachers through their combined participation in community service, and to get a sense of involvement in the task of nations building. The motto of NSS is "Not me, Not yo, but We".

The NSS was started in RIHS in the year 1983. The service NSS unit of this college over the years have been highly commended. At present, two units of NSS, one of the girls and the other for the boys, are functioning. Each unit has 50 volunteers and is headed by an NSS officer.

Objectives:

- 1. To make the students understand the community in which they are living.
- 2. To make them realize their role in the community.
- 3. To build a social and civic responsibility.

- 4. To find practical solutions to individuals and community challenges.
- 5. To acquire skills in mobilizing community participation.
- 6. To develop leadership qualities and democratic attitude.
- 7. To bring capacity to eater emergencies and natural disasters.

Rules:

- a) All bonafide students of the college are able to apply for enrolment in NSS.
- b) The selection for admission in N.S.S. will be made by interviewing students personally
- c) A minimum of 75% of attendance in the Physical work classes and attendance at two camps are mandatory without which the names will be struck off from the list.
- d) Materials issued to the members should be returned to the N.S.S. officer before Annual / Test Examination.
- Discipline is the prime guiding factor of the N.S.S. The Programme Officer of N.S.S. is empowered to take disciplinary action against any volunteer violating the rules.
- f) On all matters related to the N.S.S. the dicision of the Principal is final.

(b) YOUTH RED CROSS (YRC)

The Red Cross is an international organisation meant for humanitarian services. It is a non-religious, non-political and non-sectarian institutional body. The Youth Red Cross (YRC) represents a substantial part of the membership of the Red Cross for its humanitarian commitment. Young volunteers can make a significant contribution to meeting the needs of the most vulnerable people within communities through Red Cross youth programme. This has been designed to involve young peiople as much as possible in the movement and its activities not only as workers but also as beneficiaries.

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The Youth Red Cross (YRC) wing was started in RIHS in 1996. The objectives of this wing is to inculcate the ideas of peace and social service among that of others. The aim of YRC is to promote health care, service to the sick and the suffering, and encourage international friendliness. A member of the the teaching staff is nominated as counsellor by the principal. A fee of Rs. 10/- is collected from all the students of the college for the purpose.

(c) ODISHA STATE BHARAT SCOUTS AND GUIDES (OSBSG)

The Bharat Scouts and Guides (BSG), which was founded on 24th October 1950, is a voluntary non-political, educational movement for young people, opened to all without distinction of origin, race and creed, in accordance with the purpose, principles and method adopted in the World Organization of Scout Movement (WOSM) in 1922 and World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGS) in 1928 by Robert Baden-powell.

The purpose of the movement is to contribute to the development of young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potentials and individuals as responsible citizens and as members of the social, national and international community. The Bharat Scouts and guides has been implementing their scheme in various colleges in the state imparting social and moral education to the students.

The Rovering unit (for Boys) and Rangering Unit (for Girls) of OSBSG were opened for both +2 and +3 classes were opened in RIHS in the session 2016-17. A male member of the teaching staff is nominated as Rover Scout leader and a lady member of the staff is nominator as Ranger leader by the Principal. A fee of Rs. 12/- is collected from all students for the purposde. The Rover and Ranger wing of the institution are committed to serve the society with its abolute strength, energy and spirit.

(d) NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

National Cadet Corps (NCC) is an using formed by the Indian Milatary Crops in Delhi, in which the students participate themselves. It spreads in all over the Universities, colleges and schools. The aim of NCC is to develop characters, discipline, leadership, the spirit of adventure and the ideals of selfless service among the youth of the nation. The motto of NCC is "Unity and discipline".

The National Cadet Crops (NCC Army wings) laid its foundation in RIHS in the year 2017, with the approval of 7(O) Batalion, Bhadrak. The cadet enrolment was also finished with proper physical, written and psychological test by the battalion officer and the NCC officer, RIHS in the same year.

The objectives of NCC (Army wings) is to provide exposure and motivate the students/cadets towards Indian National Army as well as towards National service.

21. SOCIAL SERVICE GUILD (SSG)

The Social Service Guild is there to provide financial assistance to the needy, distressed and deserving students of the college. Each student of the college contributes an annual sub-scription of Rs. 5/- towards the guild fund to finance the organisation.

The Principal as Ex-officio President controls the funds of the guild.

22. COLLEGE SOCIETIES

Besides the College Union (+3 wing), there are a number of other societies such as Athletic Society, Dramatic Society and Day Scholar's Association for +3 students separately and Science Society is meant for Science students only. Apart from these, there are two Students' Common Room meant for Boys and Girls called B.C.R. and G.C.R. respectively.

There is an Executive Committee of each Society consisting of the Principal as ex-officio President. A Vice- President & Associate Vice-President (to be nominated by Principal from among the teaching staff of the college.) A Secretary and an Assistant Secretary to be elected from among the students of respective wings.

The method of election of the post of Secretary and Assistant Secretary from among the students to various societies is followed by the rules as prescribed under the election rules for College Union.

The Associate Vice-Presidents of different societies are to assist the Vice-Presidents in matters relating to their concerning societies & they are to discharge the duties of Vice-Presidents in the absent of the later.

The Assistant Secretaries of different societies are to assist the Secretaries of their respective societies in all matters and in the absence of Secretaries the Assistant Secretaries are advised to discharge all the functions of the Secretaries of the societies concerned.

The Principal is the final authority in all matters relating to all societies of R.I.H.S. He may at his discretion alter, avoid, supplement, amend or abrogate any of their rules.

The objective, membership and functions of office bearers of different societies are as follows-

(A) The Athletic Society

1. Objectives:

The Athletic Society of the college is meant to promote the spirit of games & sports among the students by organising the college games with assistance of the captains and vice-captains of respective games.

2. Membership:

All the members of staff and the students of R.I.H.S. are members of the Athletic Society.

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3. Work of the Vice President :

- a) He / She will remain in-charge of all accounts and all correspondence in connection therewith.
- b) He/She is the general superintendent of game.

4. Work of the Secretary:

- a) He/She is the convenor of the meetings of Executive Committee and he / she keeps the records of the proceedings of the meetings.
- b) He/She conducts all correspondence assigned to him/ her by the Vice-President.
- c) He / She prepares the Annual Report.
- d) He / She organises the College games and maintains discipline among the students during the sports & games.

(B) The Dramatic Society

1. Objectives :

The Dramatic Society of R.I.H.S. aims at encouraging the dramatic art among the students by arranging the artistic performances.

2. Membership:

All students of this college shall be the members of the Dramatic Society.

3. Work of the Vice-President:

- a) He / She will be in-charge of all accounts.
- b) He / She will be in-charge of selecting a play or plays to be staged and fix-up the date of performances with other members of the committee.

4. Work of the Secretary:

- a) He / She convenes the meeting and keeps the records of the proceedings of these meetings.
- b) He/She is to prepare the Annual Report of the Society.
- c) He/She is directly responsible to organise the rehearsal of the play & maintain discipline among the participants for the smooth performances of the drama.

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(C) The Day Scholar's Association

1. Objectives:

The Day Scholar's Association of R.I.H.S. is to foster through cultural activities, the spirit of fellowship, co-operation and discipline amongst all the Day Scholars of the college and to celebrate Puja.

2. Membership:

All students of this college except the boarders of the College Hostels are members of the D.S.A.

3. The Secretary is to keep all the records of the proceedings of the meeting of the Executive Committee and organise the function with the advice of the Vice-President and Associate Vice-President.

(D) The Science Society

1. Objectives :

The aim of the Science Society of R.I.H.S. is to arrange seminars, exhibitions, excursions to places of scientific interest, etc.

2. Membership:

The membership of the Science Society is open to all teachers and students of science in the college. Only degree science students can cast their votes for the post of science society.

- 3. Any Senior teacher of the science faculty may be nominated by the principal as the Vice-President and another Associate Vice-President to be nominated by the Principal from the Science teaching staff.
- 4. The Secretary and Asst Secretary of Science Society shall be elected from among the degree students of Science Stream of the college.
- 5. The Vice-President shall be in-charge of all accounts and all correspondence in connection with the society.
- 6. The Secretary is to convene the meeting of the Executive Committee which will be presided over the Principal and

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all the proceedings are to be recorded by the Secretary. He/She is responssible to organise seminars and to arrange excursions to the places of scientific interest with the advice of the Vice-President.

23. THE STUDENTS COMMON ROOM

- The college provides two Common Rooms for boys and girls called Boys' Common Room and Girls Common Room respectively for healthy recreation and mutual contact among the students.
- There is provision for some indoor games like Badminton, Chess, Carrom etc and facilities of newspaper & journals which are purchased from Common Room Fund.
- 3. The Vice-President will remain in-charge of the accounts and all correspondence in connection therewith.
- 4. The post of Secretary and Asst. Secretary of B.C.R. and G.C.R. is exclusively meant for degree students. So +2 students can not caste their votes for the post of Secretary and Asst. Secretary.
- 5. The meeting of the committee shall be presided over by the Principal. The Secretary is to convene the meeting of the committee and keep the record of the proceedings. He is responsible to maintain discipline inside the common room and entrusted with the duties of conducting Annual competition of indoor games among the students.

Other Societies:

Besides the above societies, there are following societies in the college for aesthetic development of the students. Odia Sahitya Samaj, History Society, Political Science Society, Education Society, Sanskrit Society and English Society.

24. SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL AID TO STUDENTS

The following scholarships financial aids are provided to the poor and the meritorious students by the State Government, Central Governments & from college fund.

1. Post Matric Scholarship:

Stipend is given to ST/SC students by T.R.W. department of the Govt. of Odisha.

2. Merit Scholarship (Medhabrutti):

- Juniour College Merit Scholarship: Meant for meritorious +2 students securing not less than 60% marks in the Annual H.S.C. Examination of the same year conducted by the Board of Secondary Education, Odisha.
- b) Senior College Merit Scholarship:

Meant for meritorious degree students on the basis of marks secured in the Annual +2, Arts / +2, Science / +2, Commerce examination conducted by C.H.S.E, Odisha.

3. Freedom Fighter Scholarship:

Awarded to the children of freedom fighters.

4. Stipend to Orthopaedically Handicapped Students:

Awarded to blind, lame and such other handicapped students whose age bar falls within 17-30 years. They must have secured at least 40% of marks in the H.S.C. Examination.

5. Students Aid Fund:

From this fund financial aid is generally granted to the needy and deserving students who are not granted such aid from other sources.

25. UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION

The College has been affiliated to U.G.C. under 2(F) & 12(B) of U.G.C. Acts of 1956. It has been providing financial assistance for different schemes such as Development

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Grant, Merged Scheme Grant, Teaching - Learning Aid, Organising Seminars, M.R.P. (Major & Minor) constructions.

26. JOINT VENTURE COMPUTER EDUCATION PROGRAMME

One Computer Education Centre has been opened in this college with the approbation of the Director H.E. Deptt. w.e.f. 01-12-2001. So as to cater the requirement of general student in a line of their training in Computer Edn., students of +2 and +3 Arts/Science/Commerce wings can avail the opportunity of such training with the minimum cost of expenses as a part of additional Diploma & Certificate Courses along with the inter-disciplinary courses. It also extensively helps to the staff of the college providing such training to one teaching staff and one non-teaching staff each and every year with free of cost. This faculty adds as the part of professional efficiency of the staff.

27. LANGUAGE HUB (Skill Enharacement Cell)

Language Hub has been opened in the college from the session 2015 - 2016 with an object to develop the English speaking ability among the young boys and girls by which they can complete in National and International level at the time of employment.
